curriculum

Math: We are learning about various addition and subtraction strategies that will be used throughout the year as we start to work with double and triple digit addition and subtraction equations.

Language Arts: We will be working on describing the structure of a story and asking/ answering questions about a story. Students will be introduced to what Daily 5 looks like this year as well as increasing their reading stamina. mClass Reading assessments will be taking place during the first few weeks of school. More information will be sent home when testing is complete.

Social Studies: Students will be learning about the roles and responsibilities of citizens and the purpose of a government. They will also be expected to exemplify respect and appropriate social skills needed for working with diverse groups.

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
